WORDS TO LIVE BY

Many years ago I read a Bible verse in the book of Isaiah that stuck in my mind: "The Lord has given me an instructed tongue, to know the word to sustain the weary. He wakens me morning by morning, wakens my ear to listen as one being taught." This verse became my life verse. These words are alive and active in me, and over the years they have guided my decisions and kept me anchored.

Today I am curious: what words reflect our life together as a family of faith? What verse would best describe St. John's and our mission?

At First Congregational UCC in Angola, Indiana these words from Matthew 25 appear on the walls approaching the sanctuary: "I was hungry — you fed me. I was thirsty — you gave me a drink. I was homeless — you gave me a room."

These words define and guide the congregation, and remind everyone of the mission of the church.

What words guide us? What would remind us of who we are called to be? Maybe this, from Micah 6: "What does God require of us? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with our God." Or this, from John 8: "Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

If you have a life verse, I'd love to know about it! And if you think of a scripture that describes our church family, please let me know. I hope that one day soon we will have the living word on our walls ... words

that remind us of who we are in Christ. Words that keep us anchored and inform our decisions.

Physical Items Donation Policy

GOT STUFF?

This policy applies to physical items up to and including musical instruments, wall art, furniture, and bric-a-brac. It excludes financial donations. Physical item donations must be discussed with the Facilities Team before the items are brought to the church. The Facilities Team reserves the right to decline to accept any physical item donations. Unsolicited donations will be considered abandoned property and subject to the abandoned property clause below. Physical items left in the church will be considered abandoned and become church property, to be utilized or disposed of at the Facilities Team's discretion. The Facilities Team may or may not attempt to contact the item's owner, at their discretion. Once ratified by the Church Council, this policy will be published via email and paper mail. Individuals who have previously donated physical items will have 60 days from the first publication to claim any previously donated physical items and remove them from church property. Once the 60 days have passed, donors relinquish any and all claims to previously donated physical items, and they become the sole property of the church, to be used or disposed of at the discretion of the Facilities Team (which currently is Carl, Pastor Judy, and Evelyn).

Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

BECOMING GOOD SAMARITANS

St. John's is working to help our neighbors! We continue to receive calls for help with rent, electricity and water bills, and food.

In September, we received 22 requests for help with Consumers shut-off notices, 6 for water shut-off notices, 10 for rent/eviction assistance, 4 for emergency food assistance, and 1 for emergency motel stays. Paperwork was submitted and checks requested for 16 people: 8 for Consumers shut-offs, 3 for water shut-offs, and 1 for eviction assistance, and 4 received food. Everyone is offered additional assistance through other agencies.

In September many forms of assistance ended. Please pray for our neighbors in financial need, and consider making a monetary gift to our Samaritan Fund.

JOIN THE CONVERSATION




Our Healthy Congregations group met in September and discussed our worship service. What works? What can be changed? How can we be more inviting and welcoming during worship?

The Church Council met on September 8 and the following business was discussed:


- American Red Cross annual lease was approved;
