From the Pastor's Screen

DARK NIGHT OF THE SOUL

During these cold, gloomy February days I am reminded of the dark night of the soul. It's a great and terrible season -- a time when God seems far away, when prayers bounce off the ceiling and return unanswered, when we question everything we thought we knew *for sure*. God's silence is nearly unbearable.

I experienced the dark night a few years ago. I had resigned from a church position, fully expecting to be called by a new, loving, growing family of faith. It was going to be a fresh start, filled with excitement and promise ... until it wasn't. The calls came, but I knew in my heart that I couldn't say yes. The Spirit of God was confounding all my plans. In my darkest moment, with loud sobs and many tears, I buried my pastoral dreams in a fresh grave in a cemetery.

The darkness lasted several months. Without my church family to fall back on, I reached for my faith -- but it failed me. God did not speak. I had walked away from my dream to be a minister, but a new vision had not yet arisen. I was lost.

I began to question everything I believed, and a great shift began to take place in me. I released beliefs that no longer served me, and I explored spirituality with curiosity.

St. John of the Cross wrote:

"O dark night, kindled in love with yearnings--oh happy chance! The endurance of this darkness is preparation for great light." The darkness has a job: it invites us to change. It *demands* that we change!
The longer we resist, the longer it persists.

Are you in that place where nothing seems right? Where there is no way forward? Where there is no light for your path, and you feel forgotten?

Oh happy chance! God has planted seeds in you that are beginning to stir and grow. Yes, it's painful. It's uncertain -- but transformation is at the door!

Lent Book Study


GOOD ENOUGH




JOIN THE CONVERSATION!


Council Update
