## From the Pastor's Screen

WOW!

Where have you seen God lately?

If you listen to the nightly news, you're probably thinking God went on vacation. Inflation is soaring, gas prices are crippling, and groceries are too expensive for many families.

Violence is increasing, mass shootings are happening every day, and basic healthcare rights are being challenged.

Yet, in the midst of all this, the sun rises and sets. The flowers are blooming, the birds continue to sing, gardens offer their bounty, and the people of God continue to pray.

Author Edward Hays suggests that the start of each new month offers a chance to continue the quest for signs of the Astounding One -- the One we call God. Whenever we see something that causes us to say, "Wow!" God can't be far off. Hays writes, "'Wow' is a one-word prayer of adoration, a non-religious single word abbreviation of the seraphim's ecstatic cry, 'Holy, holy, holy!"

When is the last time you saw something so amazing that you said 'Wow"?

For me it's a blazing sunset, a child's laugh, a bluebird or an eagle. It's a dog frolicking, a gentle breeze, a brand-new book. It's a hymn sung with full hearts and uplifted hands. It's the smell of burning candles. It's people helping one another even when they disagree. Wow!

This month let's limit our news time and enlarge our quiet time. Let's focus on being present to what is right in front of us: a divinely supported world that continues to delight and amaze us. Let's focus on gratitude and not let a day go by without noticing something that makes us shout "Wow!"




### Summer Elder Meeting July 17

#### Council Update


The Church Council met on June 8 and the following business was discussed:
