From the Pastor's Screen

Last month Evelyn introduced me to TikTok. TikTok is an app that features short videos, usually around 15 seconds long. Users record themselves playing pranks, singing, dancing, talking – anything to be amusing. It seemed like a confusing waste of time to me, until I found out that a UCC minister in Atlanta has been using TikTok to explain what it means to follow Jesus.

"Pastormattchat" (a.k.a. Rev. Matt Laney of Virginia-Highland Church) uses TikTok videos to reach young people. His simple videos show him holding a succession of signs (like the old Burma-Shave road signs). Here's one example:

"The difference between Evangelicals & Progressives."

"Evangelicals use scripture to understand LOVE."

"Progressives use LOVE to understand scripture."

"Discuss."

He has over 100,000 followers. Think about that! I am now one of the 100K followers, and I look forward to watching Pastor Matt's newest sign show. (I also enjoy watching Grandma Biddy, but that's another story.)

TikTok became one of the fastest growing brands in 2020. It has only been around for five years, but young viewers get hooked quickly. In fact, some have raised concerns over its addictive quality for young people who want constant stimulation.

I prefer a book and a cup of coffee. But TikTok can be a fun diversion if you're waiting in line somewhere or taking a quick break. When I tap the app, I look for Pastor Matt's latest, and I haven't been disappointed.

Matt's signs challenge us to rethink our spirituality and our faith. When are we following scripture, and when are we swallowing doctrine? The children of this generation are naturally curious and distrustful, and they are simply not going along with old doctrine. They desperately want to enjoy their lives without bowing to culture. That is admirable – but for many of us, it also feels scary and uncomfortable.

My hope for St. John's is that we will look critically at scripture - even when it makes us uncomfortable - and find relevant ways to apply it to our lives today. To do that, we have to be willing to play. We can't be afraid of technology. We can't expect our younger friends to approach faith the same ways we did. And we can't expect them to stay for more than 15 seconds.

We can reach people on TikTok, but I confess, it makes me a little nervous. I'm still getting used to Facebook live videos! Frankly, I can use some help.

Please pray with me that we can share our faith in unexpected and new ways. There's a whole world waiting to hear some good news. Time is short, and the clock is ticking.


