# From the Pastor's Screen

#### **ACCEPTING ADVENT**

Arriving on the island of Dominica was exciting. There's a narrow, short airstrip that's tricky to maneuver on a good day. This wasn't a good day. A storm had been forecast which kept us grounded in Miami for almost an hour. We all cheered when the plane got cleared for takeoff, but as we neared our destination, we flew right into the storm. It had moved, ferociously, right into our path. The pilot apologized for the bumpy ride and instructed, "Prepare the cabin for landing." But we didn't land.

As the plane approached the airport, a sudden gust of wind buffeted us. The pilot had to abort the landing and took the plane straight up, trying to get us out of the tempest. Everyone became alarmed at the sudden change, and the passengers grew quiet. I glanced out the window and saw the tiny airstrip far below us. *That's where we should be*, I thought.

Maybe not. What if where we are is exactly where we should be?

Advent is a time filled with "shoulds" for many people. We should buy gifts, we should attend family gatherings, and we should decorate, bake cookies and send cards. A 2012 study found that 45 percent of adults would prefer to skip the holidays altogether. We feel the lack of time and money and we dread family get-togethers. We would prefer to jump straight to January.

We believe we *should* be happier. But at this time of year, for many, the loss

of loved ones is keenly felt: "They should be here ... it's not the same without them."

Advent invites us to accept. Accept where we are. Accept where our church is. Accept the loss of people and traditions we love. Once we let go of "should" and lean into "accept," we can find the sacred in every place, in every moment, in every face.

As the plane soared upwards, I felt the power of the storm. If we had landed, we would have crashed. Where we were – thousands of feet above Dominica – was exactly where we should have been. Eventually, we landed, and everyone aboard cheered.

We too are exactly where we should be. Hooray! This Advent, as we await the Christ Child, let's practice acceptance. No money for gifts? We'll write a letter instead. Too much to do? We'll learn to say "No." Mourning loved ones? We will carry them with us.

Let's notice Christ all around. The ride may be bumpy, but we are right where we should be.

LEAP is funded by grants from the United Center for Caring.






# Baby Sprinkles




