

From the Pastor's Screen

SHELTER IN THE STORM

Last month while cleaning out our mother's garage, my brothers and I found three tiny kittens up in the rafters. Days old, they mewed and wriggled, searching for their mother. She was outside the garage pacing -- alert, watchful.

While I found a carboard box, my brother John carefully scooped up the kittens. Chuck found a piece of foam which made a nice bed. Relocated, the kittens settled down for a nap as we placed the box in the barn, just inside the open door so mama could find them. My mother called from inside the house, "Make sure they're all the way inside the barn! They need shelter."

Shelter -- inside, out of the elements, warm, safe, and dry. Don't we all need that?

The dictionary defines shelter as a place giving temporary protection from bad weather or danger. Shelter can also be a verb, to protect or shield from something harmful. Our church was a shelter for those who were without power last February.

I'm wondering if we can be another kind of shelter -- a shelter for churches.

Every week churches are closing.

Another church in Jackson held their last service on April 30. They've run low on members, money, and clergy. They love their church family, and they are searching for a way to keep their family together. Just like the mama cat, they've been pacing, watching their family move and adapt, warily eyeing

the circumstances that threaten their beloved faith communities.

Could we shelter these faith families here at St. John's? Could we share our office space, classrooms, parking lot, and sanctuary? Why wouldn't we? I can't think of a single reason why not.

What would this look like? St. John's would not gain members. We would simply open our doors and our hearts. Churches in crisis could use our building for worship. They could stay together. Their offering dollars and gifts might help us keep the lights on. They could partner with us in our missions. As time goes by, if they find it comforting, they could join our worship. Or not. Who knows what might happen?

If this is a future path for St. John's, then I propose a new name for our building: *Partnership Place*. In scripture when people partnered with God in a specific way, God changed their names. Abram became Abraham. Simon became Peter. While our church will always be St. John's UCC, our building might become "Partnership Place -- the home of St. John's UCC ..." plus the names of congregations who choose to join us here.

What might it look like if we had three worship services here every Sunday – all different denominations? What if each faith family brings its own special gifts, which we all share? We have much more to offer than a cardboard box inside the barn doors. We can provide everything our fellow Christfollowers need.

Psalm 91 says, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." Let's be a refuge and shelter for others.

BECOMING GOOD SAMARITANS

In April our Samaritan Fund distributed \$400 in assistance. We had 4 requests for help with rent; one payment was issued. One person requested water bill assistance; one payment was issued. We received 9 requests for help with Consumers bills; five payments were issued. Requests for help with motel stays and gas money were referred to other agencies. Eight persons received emergency food. Twenty three participated in the Showers for Homeless program.

Our Community Food Pantry was held on April 21 and continues to serve families in need. Last month we provided 1800 pounds of food and served 106 individuals, representing 263 family members. Baby Sprinkles and Kids' Closet provide clothing up to size 14, in addition to baby items, infant clothing, and diapers. Last month 34 families received items; 56 children were served.




You're Invited!







