JUNE 30-JULY 4

The United Church of Christ General Synod 34 will be held this year in Indianapolis; Pastor Judy and Michele Wilson will represent our church. The theme is from Isaiah 43:18-19 -- "Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." The keynote speaker is Nadia Bolz-Weber, an ordained Lutheran Pastor and the author of several books, including Accidental Saints and Finding God in All the Wrong People. Seventeen resolutions will be introduced, including one submitted largely by the Michigan Conference entitled "Encouraging a Plant-based Life." From the Pastor's Screen

STEPS OF DELIGHT

Last month I bought myself a gift, something I've been wanting for a long time. It was on sale, half-price, and I couldn't resist. I bought a Fitbit. It looks like a sleek wristwatch, which not only tells time but also counts my steps, monitors my heart rate, tells how many calories I've burned, and tracks my "zone minutes" (when I'm exercising enough to get my heart rate up). I was delighted! Then I became slightly addicted.

Several times each day I check to see how many steps I've taken and how many calories I've burned. I punctuate the day with dog-walking which Remi and Jackson love. It's so rewarding to track my daily progress.

My Fitbit rewards me -- fireworks buzz across the screen with a floating banner that reads "10,000 steps!" That little reward is all I need to keep walking, because it won't happen again until I've walked 20,000 steps. Those buzzing fireworks feel like a party on my wrist.

I wish God were more like a Fitbit.

Wouldn't life be easier if God gave us constant feedback? "You were wrong, try again." "Keep going! You're doing great." "You should apologize." Maybe God would reward us, saying, "You were kind today. Good job!"

God, however, is usually silent. I try to follow Jesus, yet life doesn't get any easier. Decisions seem impossible to make. I ask God for guidance, and there's no answer. No fireworks, no buzz, no specter floating by with

encouragement. God is too quiet ... or is she?

The Psalmist wrote, "The Lord makes firm the steps of the one who delights in him." What does it look like to delight in God? When was the last time you felt delighted about anything?


When we feel delight, God's Spirit is delighted in us. Our emotions provide our feedback, letting us know when we are following God's leading.

Culture teaches us to follow the crowd, to do what is approved by society, even when our hearts resist. Jesus' actions often flew in the face of what was customary or accepted. Jesus delighted in God by following his heart, which often made people angry. When we're honest about our feelings, we acknowledge the Spirit of God within us. The Spirit leads us to live our truth, even when it makes others feel a bit uncomfortable. Psalm 51 tells us, "You desire truth in my inward being ... you teach me wisdom in my secret heart."

My Fitbit, however, doesn't understand truth. Last week I was relaxing in an easy chair, petting Jackson's head, when my Fitbit buzzed with miniature fireworks, announcing "10,000 steps!" My feet weren't even on the ground. Oh, technology, you disappoint me!

God, you do not disappoint. You have placed your Spirit within each of us, to guide our steps and light our path. Let delight show us the way. Amen.


AND TECH FUND UPDATE

CENTERING PRAYER ON JUNE 27, AT 5 PM




Partnership Team

Council Update

The Church Council met May 10, and the following items were discussed:

- The projected interest income from Charles Schwab investments will be more than \$12,000 in twelve months.
- Roofing bids are being collected.
- Constitution by-laws governing the Social Justice Team need to be amended.
- A congregational meeting for the above-mentioned by-law change and review of roofing quotes was scheduled for July 9.
- The kitchen stove hood has been cleaned but needs additional maintenance.
- A water shut-off valve needs to be installed.
- The amount needed for tech upgrades has been received and the work will be scheduled.
- MyBakery contract for one year will be renewed.
- \$700 from the Timothy Fund will be given to Nation Outside.
