**CONGREGATIONAL MEETING JULY 23** 



## From the Pastor's Screen

FEELING CONTENT

Last December a coaching class was advertised in the Michigan Conference newsletter, and I felt drawn to it. I wanted to be a better minister, and I hoped this class might provide the tools I needed, so I enrolled.

Clergy coaching is simply asking really good questions. The belief is that every person has within them the knowledge and resources needed to solve their problems. As Albert Einstein said, "We cannot solve our problems with the same thinking we used when we created them." Every problem can be solved if we approach it with curiosity. A coach asks the questions that help people shift perspective and change thought patterns.

After two weeks I was hooked. I loved being back in school. The instructor suggested completing the second session which would begin in November of this year. I reasoned that a coaching credential might later provide a side business for retirement.

Fortunately, I came to my senses.

When the enrollment opened for the November intensive, I realized that I had a schedule conflict and would not be able to take the second class. I expected to be disappointed, but instead, I felt nothing but relief.

I realized that somewhere along the way my goal had been forgotten. I took the class to be a better minister - not to get a coaching credential. The goal was achieved. I learned strategies that help me better serve you as your pastor.

I have also been blessed with my own coach, Alice W. Hunt. Alice is a past president of Chicago Theological Seminary and retired executive director of the American Academy of Religion. Her insight is invaluable.

Most importantly, I discovered that I am content right here at St. John's UCC. I love serving here, and I know this is where God wants me to be. I don't need to earn another credential. I feel fulfilled – and it feels delightful.

Someday, if God leads, I may complete the coaching credential. But not today. Today I just want to be the best pastor I can be. Thank you all for letting me serve here.

In years past, a list of intended annual contributions was presented at the January congregational meeting for approval. The funds are earned from interest revenue from the Living Memorial Fund. Proposed changes to our current constitution and policies will allow us to support service organizations throughout the year in a timely manner as needs arise. Disbursements will be approved by the Council and published in meeting minutes, in the newsletter, and during worship announcements. Flexibility is necessary in a world where issues surface quickly throughout the year.







