From the Pastor's Screen


CERTAIN SAFETY

A year ago, when Keith and I adopted our standard poodle Jackson, our older dog Remi decided to run away with his new playmate. On two occasions we found both dogs a half-mile from home. Who knows what thoughts were in those little dog brains? They felt like running, so they ran.

We bought two GPS collars for the dogs and set up a virtual dog fence surrounding our property. The dogs can go wherever they want, within limits - and the whole time I can watch them on an app on my phone. Remi's little face moves around the screen as I follow him wherever he goes, from the comfort of my warm house. Jack's doggy face is usually close by. If they get near our property limits, their collars chime a warning sound. If the dogs go past the boundary, their collars give them an unpleasant buzz. If we want them to come home, their collars will whistle, and they come running. It's heavenly! We don't have to worry about our boys. They stay safe.

God doesn't need a cell phone app to keep us safe. Everywhere we go, God sees us. If we're working, or worrying, or napping in the sun, we are always under God's watchful eye. If we get too far away, a little chime might slow us – it might be a phone call, a medical report, or a note from a loved one.

If we persist in moving away from God's Spirit, we might get a little nudge – an uncomfortable feeling what warns us to stop. A prick of conscience,



a word of warning, a frightening dream, or a friend's admonition.

We're free to wander. We can explore, enjoy, choose, build, help, create. Then God whistles, and our days end. We find ourselves on God's back porch, waiting at the door. The lights glow with warm welcome. We pass through the door, and it closes. We are home. We are safe.

We were safe all along. We just didn't know it.

Frederick Buechner wrote, "Here is the world. Beautiful and terrible things will happen. Don't be afraid." Even when terrible things are happening, we are always connected to God. We are never far from God's presence. Even if we run away from God, we are seen. We are safe. Like little doggy faces on a cell phone.




