


Joint Witness Updates

UCC Genesis Grant Awarded for Partnership Project

With support from the Michigan Conference staff and several local agencies, St. John's United Church of Christ was awarded a Genesis Grant of \$5,000!

This grant will provide funding to hire two consultants from Potentials Coaching and Consulting. One consultant is a UCC minister, and one is a Presbyterian minister. They will guide and support our joint witness project with Westminster Presbyterian Church.

We are embarking on a unique journey of combining two separate entities into one family of faith. We anticipate a few issues to arise along the way. The guidance from seasoned consultants who have experience in joint witness ministry projects like ours is necessary and priceless.

A calendar of events will be distributed in the coming weeks as we schedule dates to meet with the consultants. **Participation by all members of SJUCC and WPC is strongly encouraged.** We want everyone to feel heard, included, and appreciated as we move forward in partnership.

Worship Committees will include Worship Planning, Music, AV Tech.


Nurture Committees will include Christian Education, Member Care, Fellowship.

United Center for Caring

From the Pastor's Screen

Sing!

I feel like a kid with a new toy.



Every spring when the songbirds return, I hear their morning songs and I wonder, "What's *that* bird?" A few years ago, Cornell University developed an app called "Merlin." Merlin will record bird songs and identify the birds – right on your cellphone. I downloaded the app, and now I can ask Merlin, and Merlin names each bird. It's like magic.

Recently, here in my Indiana woods, the songbirds were singing their hearts out. I set my phone to record, and Merlin began to work. On a ten-minute walk, Merlin identified 26 different birds. My old favorites were here – Robins, Redheaded Woodpeckers, Goldfinches, Cardinals, and Wrens. They joined the Orioles, Juncos, and Catbirds. They were all singing together, a glorious song to welcome the new morning.

Then I noticed a few unfamiliar birds: the Nashville Warbler, Common Yellowthroat, Warbling Vireo, and Eastern Towhee. Birds who have been living nearby all along, but I didn't know it. Merlin identified their morning songs, and I was amazed.

We are just like songbirds. Here at St. John's, we've been singing together for many years. We're very familiar with our song and our singers. This year, some new birds are appearing -- birds who have lived nearby all along. Birds who sing a new song, a different song, and want to join our chorus.

Enjoying the sounds of a Tufted Titmouse or a Mourning Dove will be lovely! But what if one of our new birds sounds more like a crow? Or a screeching Bluejay? Or a gobbling turkey? What happens if they sit in our nest? What if they roost in our tree? What if they eat our worms?

What if all these new birds attract the neighborhood cats?

Yes, beloveds, all sorts of things can go wrong when we welcome new birds into the flock. In July, our Presbyterian family will arrive. There may be squabbles over music, sacred items, and wall space. We may feel squeezed out of our nest. If that happens, let's remember the songbirds.

Somehow, despite their differences, they all sing together.







