From the Pastor's Screen

SPIDER STICK



I love this time of year, especially early morning walks with my dogs, except for one small thing: Spider webs.

Imagine a beautiful, wooded path with two energetic dogs bounding ahead of you. The early dawn sky is heavy with gray clouds, and the air is still and cool. You walk along, enjoying the beauty of nature ... when suddenly you faceplant directly into a spider web stretching invisibly across the path. Your body reacts before your brain does. You frantically dance around, trying to get the webs - and the spider - off your face, hair, and clothes. Ugh!

When I told my son about the spider webs, he said, "Just carry a spider stick." A spider stick?

A spider stick is a long branch that is thin enough to carry easily. I wave the stick in front of me as I walk, and the stick gathers the spider webs before my hair does. Sometimes I have my spider stick in one hand and a flashlight in the other for those predawn and latenight walks. It has saved me from many sticky entanglements.

It works so well I'm wondering why we don't have spider sticks for all the hardships of life that surprise us. Wouldn't it be handy to have an early warning system that trouble is ahead -- before you're pulling webs out of your eyelashes?

Over the past several weeks I've walked into plenty of webs -- spider and otherwise. I was surprised to find I had two "spider sticks" ready to help: Claire Bamberg and Trace Hayworth. Our consultants found me tangled in webs more than once and carefully set me free. They will soon be sharing their recommendations with our congregations, and with their guidance we will begin to carefully unwind from ideas and plans that were just too sticky.

These "spider sticks" will help us avoid unwanted surprises. I hope you will embrace their proposals and wield them into our future.

Fun Fellowship Ahead!


October 19: Potluck (5 PM) & Movie (6 PM) at Partnership Place.

Mark your calendars for Love INC's fundraiser on Saturday, October 12.


"Love in the name of Christ" helps residents obtain ID cards and birth records, household items, bus fare, utility assistance and more.




