



Winter Warmth Ministry



Attendance Charts







WPC Update on Ridgeway

In late January, session had a Zoom meeting with Cal Bremer and Beth Dyer from Presbytery regarding the sale of the building and property on Ridgeway. Patriot Realty, based in Grand Rapids, is the company used by Presbytery for selling church properties, and they have done well at moving church properties. Session, Presbytery, and Patriot Realty are working out the wording on a couple of resolutions that are required to be in place for the realty company to market our Ridgeway property. Patriot Realty has asked for a 12-month listing, so we don't need to go through the process of re-listing after 6 months. The average amount of time to sell a property has been around 200 days. Most of the items we can use at Partnership Place have already been brought over, and WPC's building and grounds team will be working with Carl from SJ to finish that task in the near future. Look for an email from Marty and Pat Baumgartner regarding a date/time for interested persons to go to the Ridgeway location to see if there is anything left at the building they would like to have.

NOTE: Items that are attached to the walls are considered part of the building. They are to be left in place and sold with the building.

Other WPC session notes:

- Session has received a letter of resignation from Libby Rieman, so the nominating committee will be meeting to find a replacement for the rest of her session term.
- Voted to continue in office: Cindy Spiess as Clerk of Session; Bette Watkins as Treasurer; Pat Baumgartner as President of the corporation which allows her to sign the listing agreement and other papers necessary for the sale of the Ridgeway building.
- The finance teams from both churches have been working on the 2025 contract for Pastor Judy. When that is in place, the rest of the 2025 cost sharing can be figured so we have a monthly amount we'll pay to SJ for our portion of the shared costs.
- When the 2025 cost sharing is in place, we can schedule our next Town Hall meeting.
