Collecting Lent

A TIME TO GIVE UP ... OR A TIME TO COLLECT?

Lent is upon us, and many of us practice fasting during this season. Traditionally it is a time Christians give up something to draw closer to God. We pay special attention to our faults and failures, asking for grace and forgiveness, as we unite with Jesus in his suffering. The 40 days of Lent begin on Ash Wednesday and end on Holy Thursday (Sundays are excluded); they remind us of the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert being tempted. It has become a time of reflection and repentance in the Christian church.

However, the word *Lent* doesn't imply fasting or suffering. I discovered that *Lent* is derived from an old English word meaning *spring season*, which points us to new life. This gave me something to ponder.

Then I received a letter from a pastor-friend, who also challenged me to think differently about Lent. He noted that during difficult times, it might be a better practice to collect something instead of giving up something.

What do you think? Should we give something up, like television, social media, chocolate, or alcohol? Or should we intentionally collect what we want more of in our lives? What would it look like to collect hope? Or acts of charity? Or time spent with people we love? What if we collected moments for gratitude or hours of volunteer service?

My friend said he wanted to "collect" time with his son, so they spent the day together. It doesn't sound like a typical Lenten activity, but it does sound like something he and his son needed and treasured. During these days of uncertainty, with many of us grappling with a constant, low-level fear, maybe this year Lent can represent not a "giving up" but a "collecting" of all that is good.

Imagine a storage unit in our hearts, filled not with objects but with memories, moments, and glimpses of the divine ... a reservoir of hope and joy that will allow us to persevere through the coming months.

As we collect God's goodness, we might find we have unintentionally given something up. Perhaps we will give up pessimism and anxiety, judgment and closed hearts. Maybe this year Lent will truly mean spring – a time of new growth, new beginnings, and the resurrection of God's love in our hearts.

Let's pass the collection plate!





Sunday School Returns


Sunday School is coming back on April 27! We need at least 2 more teachers so that each team will only teach once a month.

Attendance Charts




