### From the Pastor's Screen

#### **GOD'S MAILBOX**



Last month I attended a clergy retreat at Tower Hill Camp and Retreat Center in Sawyer, Michigan. Tower Hill is within walking distance of Lake Michigan and is surrounded by 32 acres of forest walking trails. On the first evening I spent some time walking along the beach and wandering through the forest.

Deep in the woods I discovered a clearing with benches and a mailbox. It was "God's Mailbox," and inside were pencils and paper. The invitation was clear: Write a letter to God.

At first, I didn't want to write. I wanted to walk, do yoga, take classes, and rest. Each day as I walked the trails, I passed by the mailbox. On the last day, a group of us walked together, pausing at several places in the woods to just be present, to breathe, and to be still. We paused at the clearing, and as we all sat together on the benches, I felt words rising up in my chest that needed to be put on paper.

I was the only one who wrote a letter to God that day, and I must admit I didn't "mail" it in the mailbox. I wrote and I wrote, pouring all my hopes and dreams and pain onto a slightly crinkled, damp piece of notebook paper. Then I folded it up and brought it home with me. Somehow, I'm sure God received it.

Here is what I learned: I walked by that mailbox every day, at least once, and I never felt like writing until someone invited me to just sit, breathe, and be present. That's when my soul spoke ... when my noisy world was quiet.

When have you paused long enough to listen to your soul? Like me, you might be surprised by what it has to say! During this first month of summer, pencil in a few minutes for silence and stillness, and let your soul speak to God. We don't need a mailbox to be heard, and our words will never be marked "return to sender."

What does your soul want to say?

Evelyn will be serving at the Giving Gardens at Yad Ezra as part of the Repair the World Service Corps. She will be in Berkley on Wednesdays for 10 weeks. Office hours will change to S, M, T, Th, 12-5 PM.

Yad Ezra is a kosher food pantry in Berkley, Michigan, which serves 1,500 impoverished families in Southeast Michigan with food, healthcare items, and household goods. https://www.yadezra.org/

Repair the World is a Jewish nonprofit which mobilizes Jews and their communities to take action to pursue a just world, igniting a lifelong commitment to service. The Service Corps provides the opportunity to serve with local nonprofit organizations while learning alongside a cohort. https://werepair.org/

The Jewish value of *tikkun olam*, repairing the world, involves efforts to take human responsibility for the broken state of the world. It is considered a *mitzvot*, a commandment or good-deed, to engage in *tikkun olam* through prayer, social justice advocacy, charity, or volunteerism. No effort is considered too small. It is written in *Pirkei Avot*, the Ethics of our Fathers, "It is not your duty to finish the work, but neither are you at liberty to neglect it".

## Memorial Garden Move



Most will be moved to the courtyard, while three will be collected by families. Brief outdoor services are planned, beginning at Ridgeway at 10 AM.


#### Nature Sacred

Located on the corner of Biddle and Mechanic, the Orchard is a green space that the United Center for Caring provides for our neighborhood here in Partnership Park. It has picnic areas, a water fountain, fruit trees, grape vines, and flowers. The curving sidewalk invites walkers to leave the street and meander through nature.

The United Center has contacted an organization called Nature Sacred to place a meditation bench in the Orchard. Nature Sacred provides benches which are crafted by incarcerated persons at Western Correctional Institution in Maryland. The benches come with an attached journal and an open invitation to sit for a while and write down your thoughts. A "Firesoul" appointed from the neighborhood will collect and report the writings. There are 260 Firesouls in the U.S. We hope to be the first Michigan participant.

Nature Sacred benches help people to heal, renew, and come together. If you would like to donate toward this project or serve as the Firesoul, please contact Harry Wilson or Heather Farquhar.

#### N.O.W. Grant

We have been awarded a **UCC Covenant Association** "Need-Opportunity-Witness" grant for \$1,500. We will use these funds to stock our Emergency Food pantry with pull-top foods, shelf-safe milk, cereal, canned fruit, soups, pasta, peanut butter and canned meats. The need for emergency food is on the rise as grocery costs increase and programs lose funding. We anticipate assisting at least twelve families per month throughout the summer.
