## From the Pastor's Screen

Every autumn I clean out the birdhouses my husband and I put up in the field years ago. They were once for bluebirds, but as time passed, the field became woods. Now wrens have claimed the birdhouses, and every year they fill them with twigs. When the wrens leave for the winter, I walk along the path, opening the houses and pulling out the old nests.

Imagine my surprise when I began cleaning one of the birdhouses and saw several sets of eyes looking at me! I screamed and jumped backward as mice began to jump kamikaze-style out of the birdhouse.

A week later I noticed moss sticking out of the hole of another birdhouse I had cleaned. I opened it with caution. Sure enough, several more sets of eyes were peeking out of the moss. More mice!

Then I uncovered the gas grill to make dinner. When I opened the grill's lid, I let out a blood-curdling scream – a fat little mouse was sitting inside the grill! Underneath the grates was a big pile of dryervent fluff. The mouse had created a cozy place for the winter.

The mice know winter is coming, but they don't worry. They act. They build up their nests each day to prepare.

Today many of us are worried about the future. What will happen in the coming weeks, months, and years? We have little control of future events, and it can be frightening. Worry will consume us if we allow it.

Let's remember what Jesus told his disciples. "And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? ... Therefore, do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' ... But strive first for the kingdom of God and its righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."

What does it look like to "strive" for the kingdom of God? It might look like taking care of your 'temple,' your body, and giving yourself the rest and care that you need. It might look like feeding the hungry, visiting the sick, praying, and worshiping. It might look like limiting the amount of news you consume and spending more time working for justice. It might look like writing letters, going on walks, reading good books, and making music. Maybe we need to create and collect moments of goodness and beauty and love, so that when the tough times arrive, our spirits are safe and protected.

Let's learn a lesson from the mice. We know things are changing, and change can be difficult. Instead of worrying, let's create spiritual 'nests' – collections of acts of kindness and moments of joy, like soft moss and warm fluff. Let's notice beauty every day and find comfort in the words of Jesus.

# Scholarship Fund Grant Requests

The SJUCC Finance Committee is inviting Scholarship Fund grant requests. If you are interested in a grant, please send a written request using the application form to the St. John's UCC Finance Committee. Forms can be obtained from the church office or emailed upon request. The committee prioritizes applicants for ministry and full-time Christian vocations, as well as those dedicated to helping humanity and caring for the sick, handicapped, and underprivileged. Here's the order of preference per our constitution if all qualifications and needs are equal:

- 1. Members of St. John's United Church of Christ.
- 2. Members of the Michigan Conference of the UCC.
- 3. All other Christians including our WPC friends!

We also consider members of St. John's United Church of Christ preparing for other vocations. The highest priority is given to those preparing for ministry unless there's a greater need in another humanitarian area. These are general guidelines; we will give serious consideration to all applicants.

Please complete the application form and submit your request to the church by Sunday, October 19, 2025. See Evelyn or Marva in the church office for applications. Our plan is to award scholarships on either October 26 or November 2.

up in the Community Room.


# Emergency Food Pantry


