#### From the Pastor's Screen

In 2017 I left the church I served to be a social worker. I was a little burned out, but after two years I felt God calling me back to ministry, quietly but insistently. I left my social work job and jumped into search and call.

I knew exactly what I wanted: a full-time pastorate, with a parsonage, within a two-hour drive from home. I wanted a church of at least 200 members that had an amazing website, a capable office staff, and a strong commitment to the LGBTQ community. I looked in Michigan, Indiana, and Ohio, but no church seemed to fit my expectations.

After searching for months, I began to compromise. Maybe part-time would be okay. Maybe a small church would be best. Meanwhile, a pandemic was upon us, so I went to work at my local hospital, registering patients in the ER, double-masking and trying not to bring the virus home with me. On weekends I perused the ministry listings, exploring church websites. Eventually I downgraded my expectations from full-time to part-time, with no parsonage, no website, and no staff. "Give me anything, God. I'll take a dying congregation if that's where I'm needed, and I'll gently lay their church to rest," I prayed.

That's when my eyes were opened, and I noticed a church in Jackson, Michigan. I knew almost immediately that this was the congregation I was looking for (although it took them *months* to figure that out), and then I had to wait for the interim to complete his contract. Nothing happened as I expected, nor as I had originally planned. It was the same for the congregation; they thought they would attract a young, gay pastor. Instead, they got a straight, white, midwestern farm girl ... and I got an incredible congregation.

At first it was rough. The church was closed because of the pandemic, and the congregation's heart was wounded from conflict. St. John's was on life support for a while. Things took a positive turn when Westminster Presbyterian came to visit. A beautiful partnership evolved, and I found another congregation to love.

Look at us now! We have energy, vitality, and mission. We have meaningful worship, an active prayer chain, and a Sunday school. What happened?

YOU happened. Every time God whispers an idea or gives a nudge, YOU respond. You all are the life of Partnership Place. With every potluck, committee meeting, and mission event, YOU are here. It is your response to God's invitation that breathes new life into our church. I am amazed by all of you, and I thank God for YOU.


