## *From the Pastor's Screen*

COZY FANTASY



During 2025 the news has been distressing. Social media has become a battle ground. Friends you know and love have very different opinions about immigrants, vaccines, and tariffs. Families are careful during the holidays to avoid topics that might spark an argument at the table. Due to all the tension, I've developed a new coping skill.

I discovered Cozy Fantasy books. I spend my evenings engrossed in stories about orcs, elves, rattkins, hobs, and dwarves. My favorites are dragons, who have a very powerful kind of magic, and griffins, flying creatures who are part eagle and part lion. I finally confessed (with a great deal of embarrassment) to my book club friends, expecting to be book-shamed. I was surprised to find other cozy fantasy book lovers.

The fantasy characters are just like us, both flawed and wonderful (although they might be green). They have struggles and solutions; there are friendships and arguments; there are dreams and disappointments. The best part? There's always a happy ending.

When I hear about the current events in our world, it's difficult to stay positive. News about military actions, discrimination, racism, poverty, and genocide steals my hope. When I read about friendships, adventure, honor, dreams, and justice, it doesn't matter if the characters are goblins or hobbits. It reminds me that people are still capable of good. That we come from love, that we were created with joy. Just like the characters in my books.

What reminds you that life is still good -- that God created us from joy, to experience all that life offers? Where do you find peace? I hope that our church provides comfort ... that the story of God's love, that we hear again and again, will continue to remind us that our story will also have a happy ending.

In the meantime, a little dragon magic won't hurt!

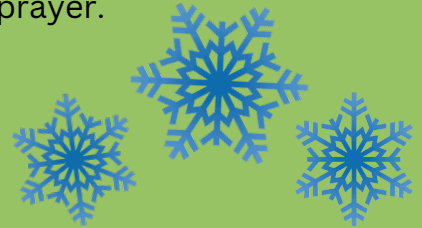

# Healthy Congregations

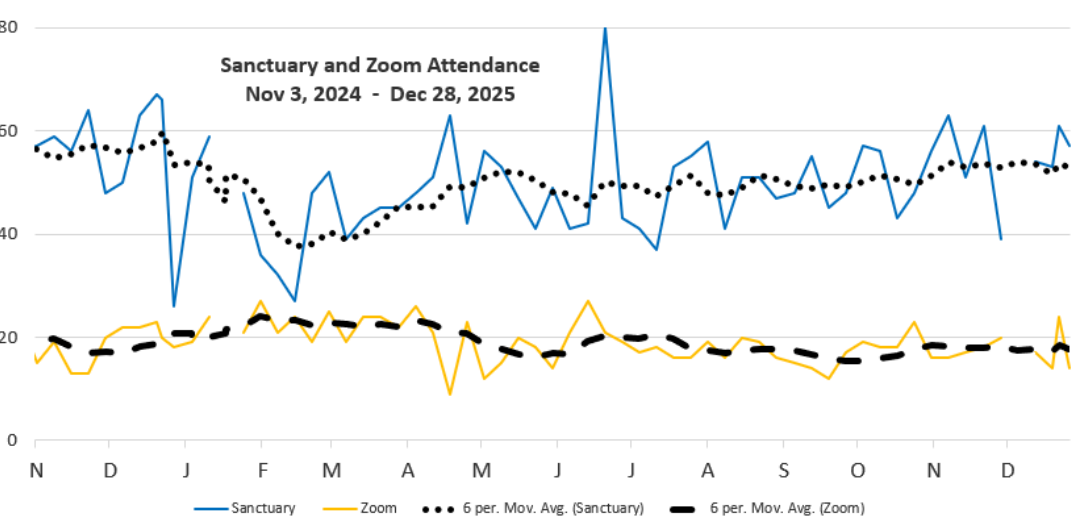

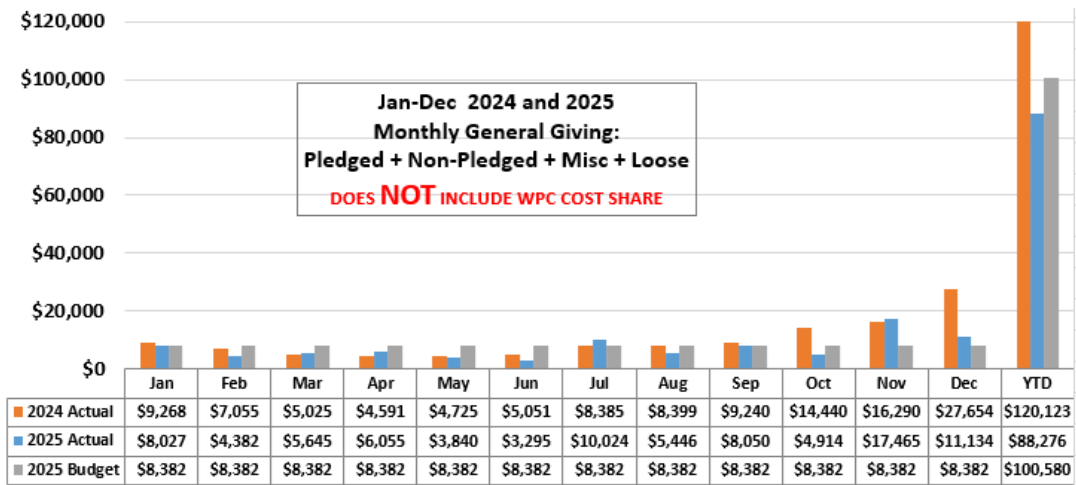
## Partnership Board

Beginning in October 2025, a group of dedicated individuals met weekly to review financial policies for WPC and SJUCC. The revised combined financial policy will be presented at the upcoming Partnership Board meeting for acceptance.

In addition, anti-racism and anti-harassment policies were developed and will also be presented to the Partnership Board. These policies are required by the Presbytery and strongly recommended by the Michigan Conference UCC.

Membership language for our Partnership Agreement was also revised. Those who wish to become members may join either Westminster, St. John's, or the combined congregation. Membership numbers and financial gifts from our "affiliate" members will be equally divided between the two denominations.
